## Slimy Yet Satisfying *continued*

It currently provides more than 1,000 jobs and a \$175,000,000 economic infusion to our region.

While significant progress has been made, and more than \$100,000,000 invested by such industry giants as Shell and Exxon-Mobil, much more remains to be done to make algae products such as bio-fuels and algal proteins both scientifically and economically viable.

Algae is nature's first plant. Unlike normal farm crops, its cells double once or more per day, which means a new crop can be harvested daily instead of the normal three to six month cycle. Micro algae (kelp is a macro algae) is grown on high-tech farms and is an easy crop to cultivate. Our panel envisions algae as one day providing such diverse products as bio-fuels and proteins to supplement animal feed and human food. Perhaps one day soon your protein shake will be made from algae instead of soy or whey. While all of this is exciting stuff, we are still in the development stage and expensive production costs currently limit algae's economic viability. But if this interests you, and it should, you are certainly in the right city to keep abreast of this "slimy yet satisfying" little plant.
