cipals to live by, holding the author a secret until the end...her father Tom, the recipient of today's award. The the Pledge of Allegiance and *Star Spangled Banner* were led by **Steve Hubbard** and accompanied by **Suzy Spafford**.

Mayor Kevin Faulconer took the stage with some glowing words for one of his mentors, and to declare it Tom Hom Day in the City of San Diego. Upon learning that Tom had once been re-elected to the City Council with 87% of the vote, Kevin suggested a follow-up meeting may be in order!

The venerable **Bert Wahlen** presented the news and it was all bad – the Dow was off, ISIS plotting, Holder ousted. The only good news was Bert's joke and that we were here to celebrate Tom Hom.

Past President **Fred Frye** was brought to the dais. In the essence of time and as the model of efficiency. Fred may have set the new standard for welcoming the visiting Rotarians. He asked them to stand in unison; we clapped; they sat. Bravo!

Fred did a marvelous job of explaining the history of the Mr. San Diego award. After 27 years of selecting Mr. San Diego in a shadowy smoke-filled room at the Grant Grille, **George Gildred** and the past Club 33 Presidents took over the duty of selecting Mr. San Diego in 1976. It's fortunate that the Hom family has a long history in real estate because Tom is going to need a new wing at his home for all of the plaques and awards he was given. In addition to the Mr. San Diego Award and the "Tom Hom Day" plaque from Mayor Faulconer, **Ron Roberts** presented him an award from the Board of Supervisors, one from Toni Atkins on behalf of the State Assembly, and one from Susan Davis on behalf of Congress.

Last year's recipient Steve Cushman took to the podium to pass the torch and to reflect on a 50-year friendship with Tom. There is quite a history between the Cushman and Hom families and you could tell how much joy Steve took in being able to present the award to his lifelong friend.

The more difficult part for Steve had to be whittling down the speakers list to Tyler Cramer, Joe Horive and Will Newbern, each of whom did a fantastic job of relating Tom Hom stories. But I imagine there were dozens more who would have liked to be at the podium telling their stories as well. Tyler had a great story of Tom's calm in the face of adversity and crisis. Joe spoke of Tom's fundamental belief that one person can make a difference, and in speaking of Tom, referred to him as a "mentor and a friend" – perhaps the most repeated phrase of the afternoon. Joe shared the impact of one of Tom's 18 guiding truths: "The main thing in life is not security, it's courage" and what it meant to Joe.

Having spent 42 years with Tom, Will Newbern could probably have told stories for days but a couple really showed Tom's vision as well as his grace and style under pressure. Recounting Tom's ability to bring together City Government, established powers, sleazy bar owners and porn vendors to make Gaslamp a reality was a bit surreal – perhaps even for a visionary like Tom.

The trials and tribulations of besting 9 suitors to become the first Asian-run TV station in San Diego was highlighted by Tom's brokering a deal by asking all the attorneys to leave the room so they could strike a deal. Even the attorneys thought that was funny.

Finally, we heard from Tom himself. He recounted his father's immigration to San Diego, his upbringing as one of 12 kids, and the lessons they were taught growing up that stick with him to this day. The mentors in his life included a school principal who taught him he belonged, and a war hero who supported his dream of becoming a public official. It was obvious that he held those mentors in great esteem and value, and he paid that forward by becoming a mentor to so many people in the room today, as well as those not able to attend. Ever the humble civic servant, Tom recounted looking at the iconic list of the 61 Mr./Mrs./ Ms. San Diego that had gone before him and asking himself, "Do I belong on this list?" Then displaying his quick wit he quipped "I'll take it!" It was the first time all day Tom Hom had been wrong. Sitting in the middle of the room I'm not sure I have ever experienced an award ceremony where the audience was palpably so happy and satisfied that the recipient truly deserved the honor bestowed upon him. The question was not "Does Tom Hom belong on this list?" It was "what took so long?"

As the program concluded and I headed to the parking lot with the impossible task of squeezing all this into the Rotator, I was thinking Tom Hom's list of accomplishments, accolades and awards were several pages long all by themselves – how was I ever going to get this to fit? Executive Director **Paul Devermann** even jokingly asked, "Did you get all that?" You bet. You see at age 87 Tom Hom had already bailed me out by writing a book on his life. It's titled "Rabbit on a Bumpy Road" and I'm buying it on Amazon tonight when I get home!

On Tuesday, September 23rd, over 40 Grotarians were treated to a behind the scenes tour and reception at KPBS.












Club 33 Singers visit St. Paul's Villa
