Now, I'm sure that everyone's lunch was a phenomenal event. But I truly believe that I was at the best one, since they served us free beer!!! That's right, Chris Cramer gave us an amazing tour and story of the Karl Strauss brewery and its long history in San Diego. And Chris, I was drinking instead taking notes the whole time, so I hope I got these details correct.

A "few short years ago," Chris Cramer and his good friend Matt Rattner were Stanford MBA grads traveling the globe and dreaming up how to make it big in the world. Chris came home from his travels

with numerous business ideas, but the one that stuck with him was his experience with a brewpub overseas that brewed it's own beer in house. This was unheard of in the US at the time. Chris realized that he had brewing history in his family through his cousin, the great Karl Strauss of Germany. Karl Strauss had come to the United States to become one of the most renowned brewers in our country. Chris convinced Karl to help him and Matt get started, and then convinced numerous friends and family members to become investors in their new brewpub, a concept not ever done in the United States.

After some comical now, but stressful-then, battles with the state and city regulators (ask Chris about the no dancing and no nudity regulations), they opened their first brewery restaurant, Karl Strauss Old Columbia Brewery and Grille, located on Columbia Street downtown, in 1989. It was the first brewery of any type to operate in San Diego since 1953 and the first-ever brewpub in San Diego. This was truly the birth of the now huge craft beer scene in San Diego!

Their first beer, by the way, was an amber lager, and on opening day people were in line all the way out the door. From their first brewpub in Downtown San Diego, they have since added multiple locations (Sorrento Mesa, La Jolla, Carlsbad, 4S Ranch, Temecula), and began bottling their beers and distributing them within California. What a truly amazing growth by a great company. And with extremely popular new beers such as Mosaic Session Ale, and Peanut Butter Cup Porter, there is certainly more growth ahead. Thank you for the wonderful lunch and for the wonderful brew culture you've brought to San Diego, Chris Cramer.
