President Michelle then introduced Chair of the Day **Mark Stuart** who showered the visiting Rotarian with elephant poo poo paper and a stuffed baby penguin (I’ll take the

latter, thank you). Mark also attempted to ensnare our visitor with some type of “lottery ticket /Zoo supporter-for-life deal,” but none of the lawyers at our table thought that was a binding contract. Mark then introduced our speaker of the day, San Diego Zoo Global President and CEO **Douglas Myers**. San Diego Rotary always looks forward to presentations by Doug, and he did not disappoint.

The World Famous San Diego Zoo first started with a roar in 1915 on Park Boulevard with visionary Dr. Harry Wegeforth at the helm. Word has it that Dr. Harry heard a lion’s roar and said to his brother, “wouldn’t it be splendid if San Diego had a zoo?” Splendid it was, indeed, and Dr. Harry launched a century-long love affair between the citizens of San Diego and their World Famous Zoo.

In the 1920s, the Zoo acquired 100 acres of hilly terrain in Balboa Park and has never looked back. Today’s Zoo leads the nation’s zoos in attendance (3.6 million), besting zoos in Chicago and St. Louis that have no admission charge. Our zoo has more than 3,200 employees, 22 vets, 100 scientists and 600 keepers, not counting those in administration. Doug then began his slide show of cute animal pictures that always generate lots of “oohs” and “ahs” from the audience. Everyone recognizes the usual suspects – koalas, giant pandas, and of course, elephants. But there are also the smaller, much lesser known species that are also integral parts of the ecosystem. The Zoo’s number one priority is animal care and Doug is extremely proud of those folks who get this done.

What does the next century hold for the Zoo? The elimination of extinction – one species at a time. And if anyone can do it, it is our Zoo. There were 22 Giant Condors left on the planet when the Zoo focused on them, and there are now 400 of them flying throughout the West. These birds in turn support the survival of 50 other species. The first Giant Panda to survive birth in the United States was born in our Zoo. The Frozen Zoo is extremely important, and is hoped to be the saving of the white rhinoceros from extinction. It has DNA from 1,000 species and 10,000 samples. It is easy to see why San Diegans have had a century long love affair with our special Zoo. Doug received a well-earned standing ovation from the audience. And President Michelle, how do they count those pollywogs, you ask? They count them very carefully! *Enjoy the Memorial Day weekend!*
