They are not in this profession for the glory or thrill-seeking attributes, but instead, to do something of significant value.

SABTs are deployed around the world and here at home. They were on the scene here locally when a home in Escondido was declared unsafe just a little over a year ago thanks to the manufacture of countless volatile, improvised explosive devices, and had to be burned to the ground. Mr. Verdi has also been on numerous deployments to Afghanistan, Iraq, the Horn of Africa, and to large events such as the Olympics and Super Bowl. It's not as glamorous as it sounds; he's usually holed up in a hanger somewhere away from the activities waiting to be called if needed.

Ending the program was a litany of great questions from those in attendance, but the one that struck most of us was from our own **Sandy Purdon** who asked Mr. Verdi where he was two years ago during the July 4, 2012 fireworks display on the San Diego Bay. The roar from the crowd was deafening, and all in good humor!
