Before turning over the podium to Chair of the Day, **Bink Cook**, Chuck had a surprise. He presented Doug Arbon with the Avenue of Service Award, in recognition for all he does in all five Rotary avenues of service. Congrats and well deserved, Doug!

Bink then welcomed the visiting Rotarians who traveled the farthest distance and began our program discussing the celebration of science. She began with a report on the progress our own club's Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Committee has been making with its partner, Joyner Elementary in City Heights. While the vision for such an initiative came from Chuck, it was Bink along with fellow Rotarian **Joe Austin**, former Principal of Joyner who is now heading up Hoover High School. The response to the hands-on, interactive events being put on for students at the campus has been extremely positive. They have even introduced activities to make the lessons relevant, fun and impactful. It's the start of what very well may be a catalyst for other programs to begin and thus encourage school age kids to take a greater interest in STEM activities.

From there, Bink introduced our guest speaker, Larry Bock, Founder and Principal of Science Spark and the Creator of the USA Science & Engineering Festival that attracted nearly one million participants in its inaugural year. The three-day event broke attendance records at the Washington, D.C. Convention Center this year and not only encompassed a series of interactive activities, but also sent scientists into the schools and sent students to technology companies to not only become more aware of all the initiatives taking place in our society with regards to science, but also to become inspired by those who do it. In Larry's words, "You get what you celebrate." It's in this vein that he seeks to get young people – and the greater population at large – to look up to scientists, engineers, mathematicians and technologists in the same way we do with professional athletes, actors and musicians. The passion we saw Larry exhude was infectious and if anyone is going to help bring a love of STEM back into mainstream America, it's people like him.

That's it for now. A reminder that Chuck's roast is only two weeks away and there's lots we can all do to wish him a proper send off. In the meantime, I'll see you all in service!
