Paul Devermann, Rotary 33's new Executive Director starting December 2nd, is a 30-year resident of San Diego. His interest in Club 33 began a few years ago when his daughter was fortunate to attend Camp Enterprise and he witnessed the positive impact that experience had on her. She came home enlightened and inspired. It was contagious and his appreciation for the organization became rooted. Born and raised in Illinois, he graduated from Northern Illinois University before launching his career at San Diego based Oak Industries. Paul worked for Oak for several years, earning his MBA before being promoted and moved to their Rancho Bernardo headquarters.
