STEM COMMITTEE UPDATE

On Wednesday, Oct. 16, Club 33 hosted its first STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) program for students, 3rd - 5th graders at Joyner Elementary School, where our member **Joe Austin** is Principal. Ocean Discovery Institute (ODI), an award-winning nonprofit focusing on environmental research, stewardship and education, was the presenter-facilitator, and excited and engaged the students with hands-on experiments comparing the density of fresh vs. salt water, and warm water vs. cold. In addition to the 60+ students who participated in the afterschool enrichment program, **Doug Arbon, Craig Blower, Chuck Pretto, Dick Eger, Joe Austin and Bink Cook**, plus SDSU Rotaractors Josh Beverly and Elle Masri, 6 STEM experts from the community at large, and 3 ODI staff members all took part.

giving. This led to the introduction of our speaker, Dr Matt Anderson, Director of Behavioral Biology at the Zoo, who has studied the habits of the African elephant population that was relocated from Swaziland to the Wild Animal Park in 2003. He and his colleagues over the world have studied the vocal fingerprints that are found in hi tech listening devices that supplement visual observation. This research has shown that the sound frequencies that we humans can hear is only 75% of

what is being emanated by herds of elephants. Gestation is 21.5 months. Females form a strong dynamic society that gives protection to the newly born. The males are encouraged to leave their home early and join the bachelor herds. The interplay between hormones and behavior is expanding the knowledge of how to save the species world-wide.
