



REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW MEMBERS ROTARY CLUB OF SAN DIEGO

Welcome to the Rotary Club of San Diego. Below is a list of requirements for new members which is to be completed within six months of joining our Club. Upon introduction all new members receive a red "new member" name badge. When you have "checked off" all of the requirements below, report the completion to the Rotary office, and then you will be presented with an official, permanent blue name badge.

1. Attend at least two Grotarian events. (Sponsors are asked to attend with their new member). These meetings include social events and fireside chats which promote fellowship between new members and teach you about Rotary. Announcements will be made at our Rotary meetings.
2. Attend an Orientation Breakfast. Breakfasts are held quarterly. Please see the calendar on www.Rotary33.org for the upcoming dates. The breakfast provides information and insight into Rotary. You will receive an invitation via email from Orientation Breakfast Committee Chair.
3. Attend a Rotary District Council meeting if they are held or attend the annual Club Assembly that occurs before the meeting at which the current District Governor is our program.
4. Be our "Meeting Greeter" at three Rotary meetings. The "Greeter" stands beside the door and welcomes members to Rotary. It is a great way to meet people. Come early to any meeting to be a "Greeter."
5. Assist with name badges at three Rotary meetings. With over 500 members, this is an easy way to learn names and faces. Contact the Badge Committee Chair.
6. Help at the registration table at one meeting. This table registers all visitors and welcomes them to our meetings. Contact the Registration Committee Chair.
7. Attend at least one Membership Committee Meeting. The Membership Committee does the very difficult task of searching for and encouraging prospective new members to consider becoming part of our Rotary Club. This committee works diligently throughout the year so that our club can maintain our membership at over 500. This committee sustains the club and assures our future success by recruiting qualified applicants from throughout the community. Every Rotarian has the privilege and obligation of seeking qualified members to join Rotary Club 33. Your attendance at a MEMCOMM meeting will prove educational in how you can assist in this important Rotarian responsibility. Contact the Membership Committee Chair.

9. Join a second committee. Committees and their members are listed in the back of your Roster. Feel free to contact the committee chair or the Rotary office to ask how you can become involved.
10. Work on one Grotarian event. The Committee Chair or a member will contact you.
11. Highly recommended but not required: Present two Inspirational Moments at the Club luncheon meetings. Consult with the IM committee chair to determine your schedule for presenting.
