Camp David is a presidential retreat set on 200 acres in the Catoctin Mountains in Maryland. It was started in 1942 by FDR when it was determined that the presidential yacht, which FDR loved to visit, was deemed to be too vulnerable to attack during World War II. Camp David is a Navy installation because the sailors that were on the presidential yacht changed their duty to the newly formed Camp. FDR originally named it Shangri-La and that name was changed to Camp David by President Eisenhower in honor of his grandson David (who happened to have been a professor of Jeff Hill).

Mike told us of both the excitement and doldrums of raising two young children in this rustic but remote location.

BEQUEST SOCIETY

There is no need to change or amend any estate planning documents as the beneficiary designation form to a retirement account directs the retirement funds at the owner's demise, not a will or a trust.

By naming our club Foundation as a partial or full beneficiary to your retirement account, the designated amount or percentage you have stipulated on the form will go quickly and easily to Rotary, thus allowing you to become a member of the Bequest Society and enjoy the special events hosted each year for members.

Usually you can obtain a new beneficiary form online, or by contacting the custodian of your retirement account(s), or by contacting your investment advisor. Once you have made this beneficiary designation change to benefit our Foundation, please let the Rotary office know.


The fiesta was again held at the home of longtime Ensenada Rotarian Dr. Eloy and his wife Charro Perez, where we celebrated another very successful year!
