

Reflecting on the tragedy of the loss of a loved one, Wendy carried us through her odyssey of restoration with an unusual insight that those kinds of deep tragedies actually make us more passionate and committed to community good. It was truly a touching!

Larry Hoeksema followed with the Pledge of Allegiance joined by The Club 33 **Singers** in a rousing and spirited *God* Bless America a cappella. Mike has been a leader in our Club's connection to the military, with a long history of activity on the Military Affairs Committee. With 40 years of service to the Country, he was the perfect Rotarian to introduce our program... the search for the Argentine submarine ARA San Juan.

Apparently, a routine patrol off the coast of Argentina turned terribly wrong on or about November 17, 2017. The US Navy was requested to assist the Argentine Navy in search and rescue operations, and ultimately in a recovery effort. Leading the US assistance effort was Captain Chris Cavanaugh, Commander of Submarine Squadron 11 and our speaker for today. It was a massive effort that ultimately failed to locate the Argentine vessel. But just as we heard from Wendy and Jen today that personal tragedies had made them more committed and passionate about the community, even in an historic marine tragedy lessons were learned to assist in any future rescue efforts. And that was this author's takeaway from today's Club meeting.


