A Star Studded Celebration For Ms. San Diego

This very special day began with a pre-meeting reception for our own Ms. San Diego, **Patti Roscoe**. The designated reception area soon overflowed and spilled out into the meeting area with Patti's friends and family. There were smiles, lots of hugs and abundant congratulations to the guest of honor.

When the meeting began, the room was packed with people from around the community, friends and fans alike. President Suzv opened the festivities by introducing Mark **Trotter** who delivered an Inspirational Moment about the evolution of the American home--going from the front porch, to the back yard, to the living room, to the bedroom --to be alone with their smart phone. Quoting Lawrence Hayworth, "There are two parts to a good city - opportunity and community." He tied this philosophy to Rotary who embraces both opportunity AND community, and that theme linked directly to our honoree, who has focused all her energy on the opportunity to build a stronger community. Mark was followed by the Pledge and God Bless America lead by Larry Hoeksema accompanied by Bryan Verhoye. President Suzy then introduced Chair of the Day Fred **Frye**, who explained the history of the Mr. Mrs. Ms. San Diego award along with the criteria for their selection.

In Fred's bullet point review of Patti's bio, he pointed out that when Patti came to San Diego she realized how important tourism and conventions were and established a destination management business which was "a brilliant idea!" Her positive impact on the financial growth of San Diego has been immense and may not be fully appreciated. Patti co-founded the L. Robert Payne School of Hospitality and Tourism Management (a nationally renowned program), and endowed a professorship in the Institute of Meetings and Events (the first of its kind in the nation), both of which have continued to enrich our community and touch the lives of students from around the world. Patti has been intimately involved in bringing the USS Midway to San Diego,

which has made a huge impact on our waterfront. Her leadership as a Trustee at the San Diego Zoo was remarkable and she reinforced their vision for many years.

Fred acknowledged some special guests attending the meeting; Congresswoman Susan Davis and Supervisor Ron Roberts, both who brought Proclamations honoring Patti. To present the award, Patti asked Assemblyman Todd Gloria, a friend of many years and a person also dedicated to "leaving it better than he found it." He was honored to be asked to present the award to "an icon of civic engagement" and felt it was akin to receiving a lifetime achievement award for community dedication in San Diego. In his words, "Patti blazed the trail as a woman entrepreneur at a time when she was one of the very few women in a corporate leadership role. She has proven her commitment to this city year in and year out for decades. She has spent an entire career inviting people to San Diego and making sure they had a great time while they were here. Patti believes passionately in our future and that fire depends upon how we invest in our youth of today. She has made a generous investment in the Girl Scouts as well as SDSU. One other note of import, and excuse the language, but "she is courageous as hell", and not one to shirk her responsibility to step forward when times demand it."

In recognition of her professional accomplishments and her volunteer and philanthropic achievements, Todd presented Patti with the Ms. San Diego 2018 Award. A standing ovation ensued...but wait, there's more! He also presented her with a State Resolution as well as a City proclamation on behalf of our Mayor that September 20th, 2018 was Patti Roscoe Day in San Diego. She was noticeably surprised and touched by all of the acknowledgements.

Next up was Jerry Sanders who has known Patti for 30 years. "Just a few of her leadership roles in San Diego include Past President of Rotary, Convis, Fleetweek, and Holiday Bowl and she has helped the police department with many events.


David Nisleit, San Diego Police Chief

She has also helped put San Diego on the map as a premier destination for countless events including the 1996 National convention, two out of three Super Bowls held here, and she put on the largest event ever held in our convention center, a National Alcoholics Conference ... wait what? No, a National Alcoholics Anonymous Conference, with 60,000 attendees from 89 Countries. Patti was also instrumental in initiating Gaslamp block parties, shutting down parts of the city, which had never been done before. Her most memorable event was put on in Balboa Park three days after 911 at the special request of Mayor Murphy. She is a force of nature and a role model to many."

The sister Patti never had, **Joyce Gattas**, came next. Joyce talked about how Patti not only gives the highest level of time, treasure and talent, but lifts everyone around her to the next level of excellence and leaves an enduring legacy. "In addition to her personal contribution to creating the new School of Hospitality, Patti helped raise over \$20M to support the school, students and faculty. Patti is on the campus more than the faculty and supports educational opportunities for students of all ages. She has a huge heart for caring."

Last, but not least, her special friend Martin Turner, chimed in via video from London. "First. words of sage advice ... if you're ever lost in the old town of Geneva, do what Patti did and approach an elderly blind lady with a white cane for directions." One of the biggest life and career lessons he has learned from Patti--everyone is someone, everyone is important and everyone matters. "From the CEO of a company to the servers at the tables, everyone is special and she treats them that way. At a dinner in London with the Royal family, she was heard to refer to Prince Edward as "Eddy" regaling him with all the reasons he must visit San Diego. Patti convinced so many people from around the world that San Diego was the place to go and they came, they saw, they experienced and they believed. Congratulations on a well-earned award.'

Patti ended with some poignant final remarks, thanking everyone for their caring support and urged members to become active and share in the impact Rotary makes in our community and around the world.
