Prez Suzy call the meeting to order, quoting our own

Nancy Scott that the Club was the place where "good people do good things"! The Prez then introduced Luisa McCarthy to deliver the Inspirational Moment. Luisa brought along retired US Navy Chief Stuart Hedley to make her point. You definitely knew this 97-year-old Navy Veteran and Pearl Harbor survivor was a Chief because he all but shouted his inspirational views!

Larry Hoeksema asked us to pay tribute to the life of President Bush as he led the Pledge. Then Larry helped us belt out the Star Spangled Banner, accompanied by Music Man Greg Zinser. Next up was Mark Burgess and the news sponsored this week by our own Rotary Legend Bill McDade. (Note – Mark is still working on the humor.) The Prez, Lauren Lek and Ava Van Vechten (daughter of our own Charlie Van Vecthen) eased us into the Art & Music Moment. Ava is a senior at Our Lady of Peace and quite the talented artist.

Announcements followed... and there were a lot of them! Prez Suzy reminded us all that President Bush spoke to the Club in 1992. She also promoted the Club's annual Holiday program on December 20. Sure to be a crowd, remember to register your guests with the office! The Prez also had wonderful news about the Club auction results which garnered \$168,000 for the Foundation...a 35% increase over last year! Then there was the "Jim Madaffer" incident on national TV! Apparently Jim appeared on the Ellen Degeneres show without his Rotary pin costing him \$350 big ones! Kevin Cahill promo'ed the Rotary Model UN Program, requesting volunteers for this great Rotary service program. Bridget Meckley announced that Camp Enterprise Legacy

Wrapping up the announcements was **Tom Vecchione** who presented the prestigious 2018 MacLaggan Award to Dr. John Lamberti. This award recognizes the Rotarian who has provided outstanding lifetime services to children. Dr. Lamberti is a pediatric cardiac surgeon who served as the Division Chief of the Cardio Surgery Department and the Director of the Heart Institute at Rady Children's Hospital. He developed a cardio vascular program which as become one of the most recognized pediatric cardiac programs in the country.

Program time! Prez Suzy introduced the very prominent San Diegan, **G.T. Frost**, as Chair of the Day. After recognizing our visiting Rotarians, G.T. introduced our guest speaker, the Chair of the Board of Port Commissioner, the Honorable Rafael Castellanos.

Rafael chairs the Port Commission, which is comprised of seven members representing the cities that front the bay: San Diego, Chula Vista, National City, Imperial Beach and Coronado. This silent powerhouse is home to the San Diego Convention Center, 2 cargo terminals, 2 cruise terminals, 17 major hotels and resorts, 20 marinas and yacht clubs, and 70 restaurants employing over 43,000 workers. In 2015, all of this generated \$8.3 billion in direct economic impact to the region. And, they manage all of this without any taxpayer funded support. Revenues to manage and guard the Tideland resources are generated from leases and other enterprise agreements. In a way, the Port was the first in an amazingly successful design to govern collectively where there are overlapping jurisdiction. Formed by state stature in 1962 as arguably the first "joint powers agreement", Chair Castellanos walked up through the many and significant improvements and changes the Port is bringing to the Tidelands. We all left the meeting looking forward to what the future will bring to our beautiful Bay!



IMPACT FUND for FLOOD VICTIMS

You may recall that shortly after we established our own Foundation, **Michelle Candland** had the idea of creating an Impact Fund to immediately assist people in need. She then generously donated to start the Fund, which was later added to by other members. The only time it had been used until now was to assist with expenses related to Monarch School graduate Zaphire Alonso when she was injured in a traffic accident in Mexico over three years ago. Since that time, we have been alert to other opportunities, but none has been compelling until the Thursday rains flooded the homeless shelter operated by the Alpha Project. Pete Ellsworth forwarded the following email from the Alpha Project Friday afternoon....

"I'm not sure if you've heard, but last night Alpha Project's shelter was flooded by the rain. What little the residents had is now gone. They lost everything. The 300 residents were moved to SDCCU Stadium in Mission Valley. The storm actually led to a hazmat response. Here is the news story. Alpha Project is in desperate need of donations – clothing, blankets, hygiene items, socks, shoes, bottled water, as well as monetary donations so they can purchase additional supplies for the residents. You can drop off supplies directly to SDCCU Stadium in Mission Valley – Gate C."

That set in motion the approval process for a grant to assist them in their situation. Friday evening the Club Executive Committee approved a request, and Saturday morning the Foundation Board approved the grant. Within 24 hours of the notification, we delivered a check in the amount of \$10,000 to the Alpha Project at the stadium to assist them in their situation. When we informed Alpha Project President Bob McElroy of the grant, he was elated. He said that it has been a very difficult 48 hours, and for Rotary to step-up without being asked was incredible.

In the event that you hear of someone in need, here is the Impact Fund policy: The **Impact Fund** supports the work of San Diego Rotary to help those in our community and beyond that are in critical need. The fund is focused on responding to urgent humanitarian and community needs caused by crisis, disaster or any other issue that requires immediate action to remediate. Our goal is to have the ability to change lives in real time with an emphasis on issues that have impacted a local youth or family. Requests for funds for an individual or organization must be initiated by a member of San Diego Rotary. The recipient must be a resident of San Diego County, and the cause must be related to one of the Rotary Avenues of Service – Youth; International; Community; Vocational.


