The Chair of the Day was **Penny Robbins**. She and her husband Mike recently started a new boat charter company called Halcyon Seas Charters with a 70-foot vessel that is based out of Ft. Lauderdale Florida and does cruises up and down the eastern seaboard and in the Bahamas. She heard JoAnne Simerson speak at a recent event and was so taken by her story, she invited JoAnne to talk to us about her passion, Polar Bears.

JoAnne has 37 years experience in the wildlife conservation field, 18 of which have been focused on Polar Bears. She shared numerous amazing photos of the bears up close and personal and talked about what makes a Polar Bear different from other bears. First off, they live in the far north spread out around the most productive feeding region called the Arctic Ring of Life. Polar Bears are one of the newest species beginning about 500,000 years ago. Five nations are responsible for the wellbeing of this mammal: the U.S., Russia, Canada (with 2/3 of the total population), Denmark and Norway. They are very unique. To start with, their claws are more like cleats, the skin on their feet is thick and covered with cells that act like suction cups and their sense of smell is incredible with the help of a Jacobsen's organ to help take in more air, much like a snake.

In May 2019, the FBI announced the appointment of 24-year agency veteran Scott Brunner as special agent in charge of the bureau's San Diego Field Office.

Brunner started his FBI career as a special agent investigating violent and organized crime and public corruption. He also served as a pilot and SWAT team operator.

Later in his career, he would be promoted to program-manage the joint FBI/Hungarian Organized Crime Task Force in DC, supervise a strike force that tackled major Mexican drug traffickers in San Diego, lead the FBI's Safe Streets and Gang Unit, and lead Louisville's national security and intelligence programs.

Brunner was also the deputy assistant director of CIRG in 2018, where his responsibilities included managing the FBI's surveillance, aviation, unmanned systems and counter unmanned systems programs, behavioral analysis, and the 24/7 command center.

He will be talking about the agency's current programs and priorities.



Most important is their body fat. They are famous for their still hunting of bearded seals and ring seals. They can assimilate 85-90% of fat from their food.

Historically, Polar Bears survived due to numerous whales that washed ashore but the advent of Man inhabiting the region put an end to that. Trophy hunting and loss of feeding grounds threatens the entire species. The rapid loss of sea ice is having a huge impact on their reproduction and life cycle because less ice means less food, which means fewer males and females who aren't strong enough to bear and care for their cubs. Cubs stay with their Moms for up to two years and only have a 50% chance of survival until they reach six years of age, when that statistic jumps to 95%. If nothing is done to temper global warming, we will see a 60% loss of the overall Polar Bear population in the not too distant future. The one thing we can do to help right now is reach out to our government representatives and change the conversation about greenhouse gasses from a political one to a conversation about saving an entire species of animal.


