After welcoming all visitors, President David fined Tom Cohen and Duke Sobek who took a \$350 fine for the Thumbprint Project Foundation, a foundation that helps homeless children. Have you or someone you know in our Club had a personal loss or tragedy? Past President (2010-2011) Bonnie Schwartz, Chair of the Rotary Cares Committee, encourages you to get in touch with someone on her committee who in turn will send the affected Rotarian lots of Rotary love and support. We are all one big Rotary family and no one should suffer alone. Thank you, Bonnie, and your remarkable committee! Bonnie was followed by a new member introduction for Rachel Luis v Prado. Welcome to our club, Rachel!

Prez David retook the helm and introduced our chair of the day, avid backpacker and MOST co-founder **Doug Arbon.** After welcoming a member from Club 22 in Rhode Island, Doug introduced our chair of the day, **Cindy Marten.** I have to admit that when I read about today's program's topic and saw

that the speaker was Cindy Marten, the Chair of the 2020 American Heart Association's Go Red For Women Movement, I assumed it was not our own member, Cindy Marten. Just a coincidence, I deduced, because our Cindy, the Superintendent of the San Diego Unified School District, with 100,000 students and 16,000 employees, would be way too busy to Chair such an important committee. Boy, was I wrong.

Here is where this one gets very challenging for me. Cindy took off her Superintendent hat and spoke to us from the heart, sharing her own very personal story about heart disease. I will never do justice to it in this short piece, but I can say it was one of the most moving presentations I have ever seen. Cindy met the love of her life and her soul mate, Sergio, when she was just 17 and he was 22. Despite pressure from her family and others (it's just puppy love), Cindy and Sergio feel deeply and passionately in love and married. They had a son, Andrew, and enjoyed their special love. Tragically, at age 41, Sergio, who appeared to be in good health, suffered a major heart attack. Sergio thankfully survived a 17 hour quintuple bypass surgery. Cindy was shocked that Sergio, at 41, had such a major heart attack and began doing research. She eventually discovered Sergio had a genetic disorder that caused his body to create huge amounts of cholesterol. This condition had gone untreated for decades because Sergio had no symptoms. Thankfully, Cindy had Andrew's cholesterol checked. At only five years old, Andrew had a cholesterol reading of 500!

Unfortunately, because Sergio had gone untreated for so long, 7 years after his heart attack, he had a Basilar Artery stroke that kills 90% of those who experience one. Miraculously, Sergio received experimental treatment and lived another 10 years. As sad and touching as Cindy's story was, it had a positive ending. Cindy's passion for preventing heart attacks has resulted in a Heart Health Wellness program for her 100,000 students and 16,000 employees. Students are learning "hand's only" CPR and two lives have already been saved by young students who learned this technique. All of the SDUSD athletes are screened for heart issues. SDUSD employees are also
