

<u>MASK UPDATE:</u> In accordance with the indoor masking requirements with the California Department of Public Health, Liberty Station Conference Center has updated their policy for indoor masking.

Starting now, those who are fully vaccinated, and also boosted, will no longer be required to wear their masks in the dining room (considered the Main Hall) or in the classrooms where some committees convene after the program. Liberty Station requires everyone to mask in the hallways, bathrooms and other common areas where students may pass through. Those who are unvaccinated are required to continue to mask in all areas. You may all continue to wear your masks, vaccinated or not, based on personal comfort.
