Community Service encourages every Rotarian to find ways to improve the quality of life for people in their communities and to serve the public interest. We provided grants for the following projects:

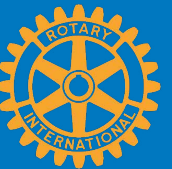
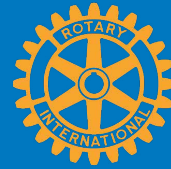

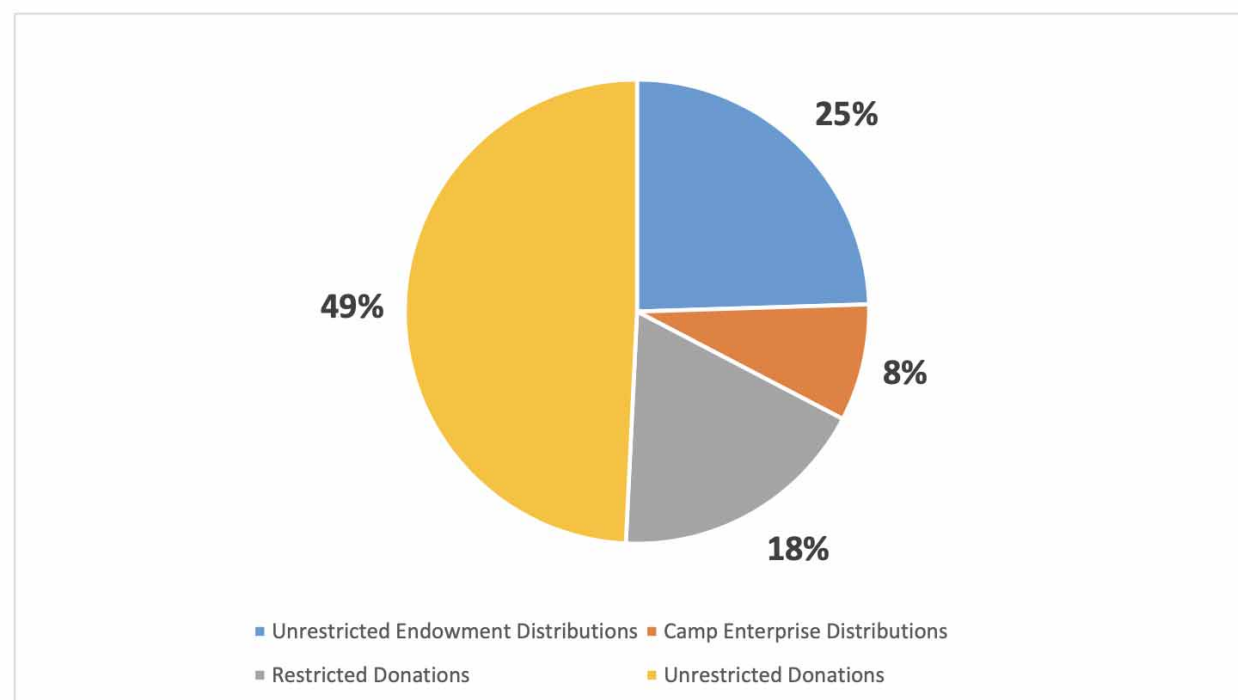
